

Students of essential workers who are attending on additional school days will need to bring their learning from home pack each day for the school week they are in (eg: Week 1-3 pack in Week 3, Week 4 pack in Week 4 etc). These students will receive their new learning from home pack on the day they are with their class teacher.

If students do not attend school that week, parents are to contact the school office to arrange collection and drop-off of learning from home packs.

Library Borrowing

With students now returning to school one day a week from Week 3, they will be able to borrow and return library books on the day they attend school.

School Lap-Top Computers

If students have borrowed a school lap-top computer, they will need to bring it to school on the day they attend from Week 3 to ensure they can complete all learning activities at school.

e Safety

With the majority of our students learning from home, they are completing some activities which require the use of the internet. It is important that parents are monitoring this usage.
