#### **Health Actions**

The following health actions are being promoted for students and staff as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic:



- 1. Wash your hands regularly and thoroughly.
- 2. Sneeze into your elbow or a tissue, disposing of the tissue straight away and then washing your hands.
- 3. Stay home if you are unwell.

#### **Return to School Reminders**

- School hours will remain 9:00am-3:00pm for all students.
- All students are expected to attend school daily (unless they have a medical certificate which states that they are unable to return to school due to an ongoing medical condition or they are currently unwell).
- Please drop-off and pick-up students from either of the main school entrances (**not within the school**). Students will still be able to walk out to parents who are waiting in cars on Mirrool Ave. Please adhere to current social distancing regulations for drop-offs and pick-ups.
- Students are to wear their full Winter school uniform from Monday to Thursday and sports uniform on Friday. Year 6 students can wear their Year 6 shirt on a Friday.
- Students are to bring their own drink bottle to school as they are not allowed to drink out of school bubblers until further notice. Drink bottles can be refilled at the two refrigerated bubblers.
- Students will participate in class sport on a Friday.
- There will be no whole-school assemblies until further notice. Awards will be handed out fortnightly in class, commencing Friday Week 6.
- There will be no incursions, excursions or inter-school sport until further notice.
- There should be no visitors to school sites unless they are essential. Parents needing to visit the school must enter the Curran Road entrance and go to the office.
- School buses will be operating each day.
