#### **Insect Repellent**





Penda Public School's COLOUR RUN BABBBBBBBB A fundraiser for our 2022 Year 6 gift to the school

When: Thursday 10th November (WK 5, Tm 4)

Where: Yenda Public School grounds

What to wear: A plain white t-shirt! Comfortable pants, shorts etc and sneakers that are ok to get colour on them!

How does a colour run lap-a-thon work?

A lap-a-thon is a really fun and healthy way to help raise funds for our school! This year as students are running, coloured Chalk powder will be thrown so students' shirts become bright and colourful!

Here's a timeline of how it will work ...

<u>3 weeks before</u>: Take home the sponsorship forms and spend the 3 weeks asking family, friends and neighbours if they will sponsor you for the event. They can sponsor you per lap or a flat donation.

Day before: Hand in your sponsorship forms to your class teacher. She will hold on to them for the event and write down how many laps you complete on the day.

On the day: Come dressed in your white shirt and ok to get dirty shorts/pants etc and check out our junior and senior course set up around the school. When the whistle blows, juniors have 30mins and seniors have 1 hour to complete as many laps of the course as possible. Teachers will track each lap you complete. At the end of the time, you will receive back your sponsorship form with the amount of completed laps written on it.
